

From the Pastor:

Living through Holy Week is an experience that never gets old. Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives that we celebrate on Palm Sunday was not His first nor His last... but it was different. It was a billboard declaration that He is Messiah/King setting in motion a chain of events that would unleash a powerful backlash of reactions, that would lead to His crucifixion, that would as well as set in motion a more powerful presentation of love and grace than ever has or ever will be offered to humanity, a message that continues to transform lives to this very day.

Jesus would join His disciples for a "last supper" that He confessed was the very longing of His heart, His will and desire to have those moments with them. It was a personal cameo of His heart to His beloved followers, where He would offer not only a covenant meal creating a union of His "family" of followers, but also offer a buffet of discipling mentorship and a demonstration of grace and calling. Like a lovingly prepared sacrificial offering - Jesus would in both word and deed express His offer of love and life as both an expression and offer of His own heart and life to His disciples then and now; it was an example for them to follow as they share the message of the Gospel mercy and life to the world in the future.

Jesus and His small band of intimate followers would take some time in prayer as the darkness enveloped them in the garden on the Mount of Olives. Jesus would prayerfully surrender to His calling, accepting the horrors that would soon begin to unfold over the next hours and through the night. A riot and litany of accusations and lies would lead Him through courts of injustice where other peoples' sins would be piled upon this humble man who refused to defend Himself so He could save even those who hurled abusive accusations that piled their own transgressions upon His bloody and beaten frame.

The power of a humanity's brokenness would lead Him through the streets of their daily existence to a pinnacle beyond the doors of the city where a cross would be his final perch, a public display bearing his bruised and bloodied frame, the life upon which He would bear the cares and sins of the world... mine... yours... every person's.

The song writer put it to verse... "And can it be that I should gain.. An int'rest in the Savior's blood? Died He for me, who caused His pain? For me, who Him to death pursued? Amazing love! how can it be That Thou, my God, should die for me?"

Placed in an empty tomb punctuating the declaration "It is finished!" we would be crushed to think the message of His life was ended. But NO! On the third day a cry that combined all the power of tearful weeping with exultant joy, of sorrowful despair with victorious shouting comes the life-giving truth broadcast by angels, women and men – "He is NOT here! He is Risen!"

There are no words the preacher can speak on Easter morning that can rival the proclamation that your faith and joy - YOUR lives - present to the world – "He is Risen! Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, because He lives, all fear is gone, because I know He holds the future... **life is worth the living**, just because He lives!" [Con't next page]

EASTER-JOY & HOPE

The Gospel of Luke-Chapter 24 in the bible called "The Message" has a sub - title called "Looking for the Living One in a Cemetery." Initial verses Luke 24: 1-8 "At the crack of dawn on Sunday, the women came to the tomb carrying the burial spices they had prepared. They found the entrance stone rolled back from the tomb, so they walked in, but once inside, they couldn't find the body of the Master Jesus. They were puzzled, wondering what to make of this. Then out of nowhere it seemed, two men, light cascading over them, stood there. The women were awe struck and bowed down in worship. The men said, "Why are you looking for the Living One in a cemetery? He is not here, but raised up. Remember how He told vou when vou were still back in Gailee that He had to be handed over to sinners, be killed on a cross, and in three days rise up? Then they remembered Jesus words." Luke later gives the story of the two walking to Emmaus. The slow, foot-dragging, style of walk.

When Jesus, unrecognized, joined them and related all that the prophets had told about what would need to transpire and then disappeared. Maybe they were singing (shouting) this chorus: "I've got the joy, joy, joy, joy down in my heart. Where? Down in my heart! Where? Down in my heart! I've got the joy, joy, joy down in my heart, down in my heart to stay." Frederick W. Faber said, "Only to sit and think of God, oh what a joy it is."

Peter writes in I Peter 3: 15 "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the "Hope" that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

Psalm 39: 7 "But now Lord, what do I look for? My hope is in you."

Edward Mote wrote the hymn "The Solid Rock." 1st verse and chorus: "My hope is built on nothing less then Jesus' blood and righteousness.
