From the Pastor:

< Peace That the World Cannot Give >

Dear Beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. As we move into the second month of 2026, many of us continue to feel the weight of uncertain times. The world around us remains unsettled. Our nation faces deep division, global conflicts persist, and many families carry personal burdens: health concerns, financial pressures, grief, and quiet fears about the future.

Yet in the midst of all this, God speaks to His people with calm authority and deep compassion. His message is not panic, and it is not despair. It is peace.

Jesus says to us: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27)

This is not a promise that the world will suddenly become peaceful. It is a promise that our hearts can be peaceful because Christ is with us.

The peace of God is different from the peace the world offers.

The world's peace depends on circumstances-good news, strong leaders, stable economies. When those things fail, peace quickly disappears.

But the peace Jesus gives is rooted in His presence. It remains even when circumstances do not change.

Many of our senior members have lived long enough to know this truth well. You have seen seasons of stability and seasons of loss. You have learned that life does not always become easier, but God never becomes less faithful.

The psalmist reminds us: "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." (Psalm 34:18)

When days feel heavy and hearts feel tired, especially during the winter months, this promise matters deeply. God is not distant. He is near. He is attentive. He is faithful.

In a time when so much feels uncertain, Scripture offers us simple and steady anchors. These are not complicated instructions. They are faithful practices that sustain us.

1. Bring everything to God in prayer.

God does not ask us to carry our worries alone. He invites us to place them in His hands.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6)

Prayer does not have to be long or eloquent. Sometimes the most honest prayers are the shortest:

"Lord, give me peace." "Lord, help my family." "Lord, guide our nation."

When we pray, God promises something precious: "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

(Philippians 4:7)

This peace guards us when the news cannot.

Lewis....**

**DO YOU LOVE  
ME?**

In John's gospel, John tells in Chapter 21 about an experience he and some of the other disciples had with Jesus at the Tiberias Sea (the Sea of Galilee), John 21:15-17 (The Message)- "After breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?' 'Yes master, you know I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my lambs.' He then asked a second time, 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' 'Yes, Master, you know I love you.' Jesus said, 'Shepherd my sheep.' Then he said it a third time; 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked for the third time, 'Do you love me?' so he answered, 'Master, you know everything there is to know. You've got to know I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my sheep.' "

In these verses, two Greek verbs are used for "love": Agapao-to love deeply, used for divine love and the love which the law demanded;

## 2. Live with faithful steadiness.

In uncertain times, faithfulness itself becomes a testimony. God does not ask us to control the future. He asks us to trust Him today.

“Stand firm. Let nothing move you.” (1 Corinthians 15:58)

Standing firm often looks very ordinary:

- continuing in worship,
  - choosing forgiveness,
  - showing patience,
- trusting God one day at a time.

Many of you carry a quiet wisdom shaped by years of walking with God. This kind of steady faith is deeply needed not only by our church, but by our families and our grandchildren.

## 3. Let love be visible in small ways.

In a divided and anxious world, Christian love shines brightest when it is lived out simply and sincerely.

“Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.” (1 John 3:18)

Love becomes visible through small acts:

- a phone call to someone who is alone,
- a word of encouragement,
- a prayer offered quietly,
- a gentle response when others speak harshly.

These acts may seem small, but God uses them to bring light into dark places.

Jesus reminds us: “You are the light of the world.” (Matthew 5:14)

We shine not by arguing louder, but by loving faithfully.

Jonestown UMC has been a place of prayer, faith, and service for generations. In times like these, the Church is called to be a place of calm, not chaos; of hope, not fear; of truth spoken in love.

Let our church be known for:

prayer that is sincere,  
faith that is steady,  
love that is visible,  
and hope that does not fade.

As we live this way, we offer a quiet but powerful witness to our community.

As we continue this journey through 2026, I offer this blessing for you:

May the Lord give you peace when the world feels unsettled.  
May He strengthen you when you feel weary.  
May He comfort you when your heart feels heavy.  
May your home be filled with calm, your days with purpose, and your life with hope.  
And may the peace of Christ guard your heart—today and always.

Remembering his three denials of the Lord and aware now of his weakness uses the word phileo in his reply.

In the third time that Jesus asked the question about his love, He used the phileo word that Peter had used and used again in reply.

Peter, as he remembered his past, felt unworthy to express his love to Christ by the strong word agapao and used the weaker word phileo.

Question for each of us. If we would be asked this question, what would our response to Jesus be?

Psalm 89 gives some thoughtful statements on love.

Verses 1 & 2 “I will sing of the steadfast love of the Lord, forever; with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations, For I said “Steadfast love will be built up forever; in the heavens You will establish your faithfulness.”

Verse 14 “Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you.”

Gloria and William Gaither wrote a hymn called “I could Never Out Love the Lord.”-verse 1 and chorus “There’ve been times when giving and loving brought pain, And I promised I would never let it happen again. But I found out that loving was well worth the risk, And that even in losing you win.”- chorus; “I’m going to live the way He wants me to live, I’m going to give until there’s just no more to give, I’m going to love, love ‘til there’s just no more love-I could never –never out love the Lord!

My life, my love, I give to Thee!

### **CELEBRATE OUR GUESTS:**

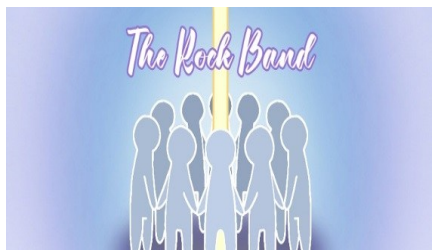

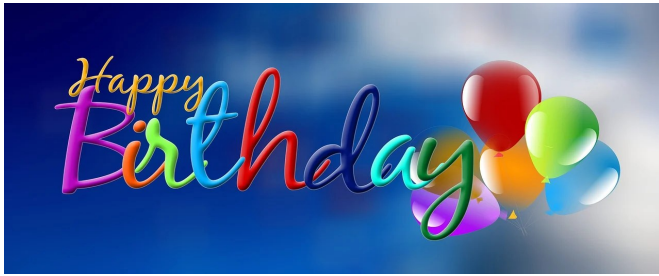
We need people interested in developing a process for securing, training, and engaging people into the various ministries and missions of our congregation. [Our Lay Leadership Team]
