From the Pastor:

"A Bold Faith Confession from the World's No. 1 Golfer"

"I believe God gave me the gift of golf, and I've always to wanted use that gift solely to glorify Him."

"That's the biggest reason why I stand here today."

These were the words of world No. golfer Scottie Scheffler (28) after winning the 2024 Masters and slipping on the green jacket. At that moment of victory, he hugged his caddie, whom he met through a Bible study and shared the joy of winning. Scheffler had made a similar statement after winning the 2022 Masters during a press conference.

"My identity is not rooted in my golf scores. Win or lose, Jesus still loves me the same."

"So what I'm called to do is glorify God in everything I do." He's also known for having an unshakable, steel-like mindset and he once shared the secret behind it. "Just knowing I'm eternally secure in the Lord gives me indescribable peace."

"In a game, you can win or lose. Especially in golf."

"But win or lose, it doesn't matter, because no matter my score, I'm forever secure in Christ." Ultimately, his mental strength didn't come from psychological techniques, but from the joy and peace he experiences as a Christian.

Scheffler's bold faith has resonated deeply with many in the American church.

Franklin Graham, son of the late Billy Graham, shared his remarks on Facebook, saying: "I'm thankful that among those who excel in all walks of life, there are still many like Scheffler who are unashamed to give all the glory to God and boldly profess their faith."

Scheffler began playing golf at age 3, has already won 4 times this season, and has notched 17 career victories over the past 5 years. At this pace, many believe he could become golf's next superstar, following in the footsteps of Tiger Woods, who earned 82 wins over 28 years.

But off course, the contrast between the two could not be starker, especially in their personal lives. Woods was arrested in 2017 for suspected DUI, and his mugshot went viral, He's also been involved in multiple scandals.

In contrast, Scheffler often says, almost as a slogan that family comes before golf.



Truth, righteousness, peace, faith, and salvation are more than words. Learn how to apply them. You'll need them throughout your life. God's word is an indispensable weapon.

In the same way, prayer is essential in this ongoing warfare. Pray hard and long. Pray for you brothers and sisters. Keep your eyes open, keep each other's spirits up so that no one falls behind or drops out.

Dr David Jeremiah in his book says, "Two things are happening today that I never thought I would live to see. First, spiritual warfare is getting much mor intense and Satan is becoming much more real. Second, too many Christians are not taking spiritual warfare seriously or even believing such a war is going on. A crisis exists!" Second: Spiritual armor available for your use.

1) The Belt of Truth-because Satan is "the father of

lies" (John 8:44)

The Breastplate of Righteousness-Righteousness protects the spiritual life of the Christian. It comes from Christ, not ourselves(Phil. 4-7) 2)

Shoes for Your Feet-Provides stability in conflict. Our peace with God through Jesus Christ gives us security in the face of Satan's accusations (Phil 4-7)

The Shield of Faith-Faith in God's promises defeats and extinguishes the lies of Satan 9 Prov. 30:5, I John 5:4).

The Helmet of Salvation –The primary battlefield in spiritual warfare s the Christian's mind, thus Satan's attack sends doubt into our minds. Assurance of salvation defeats the doubts. (John 10:28-29)

6) The Sword of the Spirit-The Word of God-The only offensive weapon in the Christian's armor, Jesus used The Word of God in His victory over Satan in the wilder-

ness (Matt 4:1-11)

The Bible as a whole is an armory from which you can select swords for various and specific battles/attacks from Satan. Prepare well!
